THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Mk 5:21-43

An ashamed and fearful woman comes to Jesus secretly, to be cured. Ruined by the doctors, alone and without a future, she comes to Jesus with great faith. She seeks only a more dignified and healthier life.

She suffers from blood loss: a disease that as a Jewish woman forces her to live in a state of ritual impurity and discrimination. She is obliged by religious law to avoid contact with Jesus. But she reaches out to Jesus in trust anyway and is cured. She "noticed that her body was healed"; Jesus noticed the saving power that had gone out of him".

This story is an example of how Jesus is committed always to liberating women from social exclusion, from the oppression of men in the patriarchal family, and from religious domination among the people of God.

Jesus is not exactly like a modern-day feminist, committed to the struggle for equal rights for women and men. His message is more that the superiority of men and the submission of women do not come from God. Jesus conceives his movement as a space without male domination.

The relationship between men and women remains unhealthy, even within the Church. Women are not able to notice with transparency "the saving power" that comes from Jesus. This is one of our great sins. The path of healing is clear: to suppress the laws, customs, structures, and practices that generate discrimination against women, in order to make the Church a space without male domination.



"PIGGY BACKING" OUR SOLIDARITY FROM ST ANNES TO AND WITH NEEDY MIGRANTS

Conscious of the communication gaps between groups and within the parish itself, a gap that many of you comment about. I take advantage of this issue of the Bulletin **to report**

<u>report back in more detail</u>, about the offertory gifts some make every Sunday and also a few items that people do drop in for people who have needs.

In the five months that I have been here, I have given out only two food parcels. The recipients merited the help they received, but here in South Auckland there must surely be others? We don't seem to hear about them. Where are our needy? Maybe we don't know who they are because of our communication gaps.

For some months now, it has come to our attention that there are many migrants in Central Auckland who have visas to work 20 hours a week and study English. Among them are many South American people. With the downturn in the economy they can't find much work and many are on the bread-line. A small Christian community (not Catholic) is reaching out to them as best they can.

Every Thursday Cecilia (Chilean) and Alex (English) collect from St Annes the food from the offertory, plus other items that have been donated including two big bags of popcorn. They distribute what they have to the most needy of these migrants(mostly are Catholic) and on Saturday they most needy of these migrants (mostly are Catholic) and on Saturday they prepare a meal for those who come. They are not always the same people.

I call this "PIGGY BACKING OUR SOLIDARITY", meaning we don't have social projects of our own here in St Annes at the moment, but we stand on the shoulders of this little Christian community to give what the "Hispanics" say "nuestro granito de harina" ("Our grain of sand").

I write this as the community leader of St Annes to report back and express my hope that we can find the needy (migrants or not migrants) among us and help them collectively as well.

Any ideas are welcome!
