

My Faith Journey Story, By Jovita Parker

I have had a very blessed faith journey, growing up in a large, loving amily where our faith was nurtured at home and at St Mary's Church and Primary School. It has been a privilege to be a part of this Parish all my life, and I have a deep sense of belonging and gratitude to all the people who have nurtured my faith journey - moving me from a 'head knowledge' to a deep personal faith in Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour, and experiencing the power, presence and comfort of the Holy Spirit over many years.

In the 1980's the Diocese encouraged all Parishes to offer "Renew". Small groups of people, in each parish, met in each other's homes once a week, and reflected and discussed the topics designed to refresh and deepen our faith. The group I was in was led by some beautiful people



who were very open to the Holy Spirit, and I recall coming home from some of these meetings with my spirit soaring. God was starting to touch me at a deeper level, even though I was not fully aware what was happening.

Soon after, a Charismatic Prayer Group was started in our Parish, and God placed a deep desire in my heart to attend this. They hosted a 'Life in the Spirit Seminar', and I was prayed with to be 'released in the Holy Spirit'. This was, and has continued to be a life-changing event for me. My faith moved from my head to my heart! The three persons of the Trinity were now so real, and so close to me. I literally fell in love with Jesus Christ, accepting him as my personal Saviour, and I experienced the presence and comfort of the Holy Spirit in a tangible way. My experience was nurtured in this Prayer Group. I developed a deep hunger for daily prayer, praise and worship of God, for the Sacraments, and the Scriptures, and a desire to

Gradually I was invited to take on roles and ministries within the Parish, and later at a Diocesan level. Even though I was a shy person I felt God's help and anointing when I responded. God asks for our availability, not our ability. I am so grateful for all the blessings God has given me over the years.

Like everyone else, life has had its challenges and hard times, but I have known God's help to get through them. Despite health issues over the past few years, I have sensed God's reassurance that He is walking with me through them, and giving me strength and help.

The words of this song convey what God has done for me:

Come to the water, you who are thirsty, though you have nothing, I bid you come, and be filled with the goodness I have to offer, come, listen, live.

I have been filled with your goodness and love Lord God, and I praise and thank you, and give you all the
